mont Chapter," we have a history of which we can be proud. Chartered in 1994, we celebrated our twenty-eighth anniversary this past February. Did you know that Eric Thorstenberg, our Secretary and Chancellor, is the only remaining active member of the Piedmont Chapter who was a founding, charter, member?

In our twenty-eight years of chapter existence, we have generated a lot of history of our own and the records that go with that history. At the end of last year, our chapter historian Ron Redner (Historian is just one of the many hats Ron wears), was the recipient of sixteen file boxes of awards and other records of the chapter covering our rich history of working and serving in the community. Earlier this year, I was the recipient of a few file boxes of a deceased member who was a great record keeper in his own right as well as the author of more than sixty historical talks that he gave to the community. The existence of these records started me thinking. What good are these documents, this history, if they are sitting in file boxes? History is meant to be shared for the benefit of others.

We are now looking at ways to digitize and manage this chapter history for two reasons: the first is to keep us from having to transfer boxes of history from person to person as necessary; the second, and real, reason is to be able to share this history with Piedmont chapter members and other chapters. There's much to learn about who we are as a chapter in these twenty-eight years of service.

Why am I talking so much about boxes of documents, photos, scrapbooks, and streamers? It's our chapter history, of course. But seeing these boxes makes me wonder what I'm doing today to write new volumes of history for the Piedmont Chapter through service to those in our community. I would like you to ask yourselves what you could be doing, through the Piedmont Chapter, to be a part of the rich Piedmont Chapter history that others will want to read about in the years to come.

We've had a great year so far and I've enjoyed every opportunity I have had to meet with you and work with you. Let's keep up the good work and write some history together.

## Note from: **Compatriot Ed Klaas**

Dear SAR compatriots and friends:

As some of you know, I have a book that is scheduled to be released this month, just prior to September's National Suicide Prevention Month. It is entitled Second Wind: Stories of Hope. It chronicles 50 people who triumphed over suicide. I'll let you know when it is available on Amazon. I hope you will purchase it for yourself or your loved ones.

However, I am reaching out to you today on a different matter. I am currently in the process of writing another book that might appeal to you even more. It is tentatively entitled The American Quarter Millenium: 250 Indispensable People of the American Revolution. It is a collection of brief biographies of 250 people who played a part in our war for independence and who helped launch our "great experiment." While it is truly an impossible task to include everyone who played a role (just listing all of our collective patriots blows past the 250 number), it is my intention to include those who were truly indispensable. I want to be as accurate and inclusive as possible and to this end, I am reaching out for your help. I can think of no better group to assist me than my fellow members of the Piedmont Chapter of the Georgia Society Sons of the American Revolution.

I electronically transmitted a tentative list of 250 individuals, and to the extent possible, their birth location, birth and death years, and a brief description of their importance. It will be my job to flesh out their histories but, before I attempt to take that on, I would like to know that I haven't left out any individuals who indisputably should make this list. So. should you be interested, I respectfully request that you take a look at the alphabetical list, think about it, and then let me know if you can think of anyone else who I might include. That may entail leaving someone out as I am already up to almost 250. I can, however, add those that don't make the cut to an honorable mention list at the end, or can swap out someone "more important" that needs to be included.

There is no rush, but I would like to finalize my list by the first of September of this year so that I can continue working on the text. If you have a moment, please think about it while it is fresh on your mind. Feel free to ask others. This type of discussion is exactly what the book is intended to create. I am also open to any other constructive criticism or suggestions that you might offer. You can send any of the aforementioned to edklaas@gmail.com. I will list anyone who contributes names or suggestions in the Acknowledgement section of the book.

The end result will be a large coffee table book, with a glossy cover, and lots of pictures, photographs, and stories. My hope is that it will be something that people will buy and display proudly in their homes and offices as we approach our nation's semiguincentennial, less than three years from now, on July 4, 2026, and for years to come. In addition, I will donate a portion of the profits to organizations such as ours that remember the past, teach our children, and honor our patriots.

Thank you for your time and may God bless America, and those who make it, as Abraham Lincoln said, "the last best hope of earth."

# America 250 SAR LIBERTY TREE PROJECT

America 250 is a multiyear effort to commemorate the semiquincentennial of the United States

Our Nations 250th Birthday is July 4th 2026. Throughout the next three years we will joining the rest of the National Society in celebration of America's 250th Anniversary with patriotic, historical, and educational programs.

One of the ways The Piedmont Chapter is participating is with the **Liberty Tree** program. We are planting elm trees throughout the community with a focus on Schools, City Halls, and Public Spaces in commemoration of the Original Liberty Tree in Boston Common (1646–1775).

### THE LATEST LIBERTY TREES TO BE PLANTED

BULLOCH HALL - ROSWELL, GA June, 16th 2023

On June 15, 2023 the Piedmont Chapter held a Liberty Tree planting ceremony on the grounds of historic Bulloch Hall in Roswell, GA. We were joined by the Mayor of Roswell, Curt Wilson, Roswell City Council members, President of the Friends Of Bulloch Hall and several other members of that group. Numerous Piedmont Chapter SAR members and ladies from the Martha Stuart Bulloch DAR Chapter were also there at this historic location for the event.



The original was a famous elm tree that stood in Boston, Massachusetts near Boston Common in the years before the American Revolution. In 1765, Patriots in Boston staged the first act of defiance against the British government at the tree. The tree became a rallying point for the growing resistance to the rule of Britain over the American colonies, and the ground surrounding it became known as Liberty Hall. The Liberty Tree was felled in August 1775 by Loyalists.

### **New Concord Ohio**

June, 10th 2023

On June 10th, the Piedmont Chapter (in cooperation with the Ohio Society of SAR and the Rufus Putman Chapter in Zanesville Ohio) a "Liberty Tree" was planted in New Concord, Ohio on a Centennial Farm.

The farm has been in the Finley-Litt family for 100 years. **Al Finley (past President of the Piedmont Chapter)** and Bernie Litt (his sister). The Finley clan are members of the First Families of Ohio. Guernsey county is the resting place (6 miles from this farm) of an ancestral grandfather who served with George Washington at Valley Forge. There were 13 people in attendance



The national goal is 250 trees over the next three years, with over 500 chapters nationally, Piedmont plans to lead the way. *Each Elm Tree is purchased from the tree farm in South Carolina and the plaque is produced locally for a cost of \$150.00*.To Sponsor a tree contact **Ron Redner**.


## **Compatriot Grave Marking**

The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) invites all Eagle Scouts interested in the American Revolution to participate in the Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Contest. The contest is open to all Eagle Scouts who are currently registered in an active unit and, except as provided in the paragraph below, have not reached their nineteenth birthday during the year of application. The year that the Eagle rank was awarded is not restricted. Contest year is Jan 1 to Dec 31.

The competition is conducted in three phases: the local Chapter level, State Society level, and National level. The competition is usually entered at the Chapter level, though in some cases, the competition may be entered at the State Society level. Applicants may not enter at the National level. Contest entrants need complete only one application for the SAR Chapter level competition.





